### A NEW PUBLIC TRANSPORT INTERCHANGE FOR WODEN

Planning is underway and construction is due to start later this year on a new public transport interchange on Callam Street. It's the first stage of the exciting new CIT Woden project that will bring state of the art learning facilities and 6500 students to Woden.

Better public transport is a key commitment of the ACT Government, and the new transport interchange will facilitate a significant increase in bus services to Woden. The interchange will also include a future Woden Light Rail stop.

To support the new public transport interchange, a number of other upgrades will also be delivered to the Woden town centre. These include:

- new bus layovers on Easty Street and Launceston Street;
- upgrades and improvements to local roads and intersections;
- improvements to active travel routes (for cyclists and pedestrians); and
- the closure of Callam Street to public transport and pedestrian access only.

#### THE CONVERSATION

From 20 November to 18 December 2020, Major Projects Canberra was out in the community discussing the proposed new public transport interchange and associated works.

We invited you to have your say on topics such as environmental and social impacts, functionality and the operation of the interchange along with technical scope and feasibility.

We held <u>11</u> community information pop-ups at various locations in the Woden Town Centre, the City and at the CIT Reid campus. We showed you maps, timelines, artist impressions of the plans and took on board your comments, concerns and enthusiasm.

We also held briefing sessions with businesess and other key stakeholders, ran an online survey, and developed a virtual room, which allowed you to move around a 3D space and view materials related to the project.

### WHO WE ENGAGED

We aimed to engage a broad range of stakeholders. Feedback is informing design development for the new public transport interchange which will deliver better public transport connectivity to Woden.



Your feedback from online comments, survey responses and conversations fell into five overarching themes:




