

This book is about our **Disability Health Strategy**.




The Disability Health Strategy is about how we want to help people with disability

Our **Disability Steering Committee** also helped us make the strategy.




The Disability Steering Committee is a group of people who

## Health information and choice



We want to make sure everyone can

• understand information about health



• get information in different ways.



For example, we can write about hospitals in different languages.



We want to support people with disability to make choices about their health.



We will talk to people with disability about the health care system.



We will also talk to family of people with disability about the health care system.

#### **Health services**



We want to give services that are right for each person with disability.



We will think about what services you need.

We will help different services to work together.



We will think about disability when we

• make new health services



• change health services



• check if services are doing a good job.

# Plans for an emergency



We want people with disability to be safe when there is an **emergency**.

An emergency is when there are problems for a lot of people.



An emergency could be

a bushfire



• a disease like COVID-19.



We want to help people with disability know what to do in an emergency.



We will make sure people with disability can get information about emergencies.



We want people with disability to get good health services in an emergency.

#### **Health care staff**



Health care staff could be

doctors



nurses



• other workers, like office staff.



We will train health care staff so they

understand disability



• respect people with disability.



People with disability will help make the training.



We will also make sure people with disability can get jobs in health services.

#### Research



We will get information about the health of people with disability.



We will find out how people with disability feel about health services.



We will use information about the health of people with disability to make services better.




We will tell you about the information we get.
